LES Japan Special Seminar with Russell Levine

LES Japan U.S. Issues Working Group consists of more than 30 members and meets every other month to learn and discuss U.S. cases regarding licensing and various intellectual property issues. On February 29, 2024, the group had a special online seminar with Mr. Russell Levine. Russell is a member of the Board of LES International and a Past-President of LES USA and Canada. He was in Tokyo, Japan to participate in the 2024 Tokyo Marathon held on March 3, 2024. It was the second year in a row that the LES Japan U.S. Issues Working Group hosted this seminar and we were all looking forward to the lecture as well as Russell's successful run at the Tokyo marathon.

Similar to last year, the members appreciated and enjoyed learning from the seminar, "Top 10 Court Decisions of the Year Affecting Licensing" which described and analyzed court's decisions in 2023 and early 2024. The issues were mainly divided into the potential use by a court of whereas clauses, the difference between mandatory and permissive forum selection clauses, the scope and interpretation of arbitration clauses and potential inconsistencies between such clauses and other clauses in the agreement, and the enforcement (or inability to enforce) post-expiration royalty obligations. After the seminar, there was a number of questions raised. Going over the decisions and Russell's analysis, and during the robust disafterwards, the members knowledge and received advice of how to draft and negotiate licensing contracts by carefully choosing the words and clauses.

Following the seminar, Russell successfully ran the 2024 Tokyo Marathon. Last year, he received the six-star medal by finishing running the World Marathon Majors in Berlin, Boston, Chicago, London, New York, and Tokyo. We hosted 5<sup>th</sup> LESI YMC Asia Pacific Conference in Tokyo on April 12, 2024.

The LES International Young Members Congress (YMC) is an organization for young LES members and regularly holding international conferences in the area of Pan-America, Pan-Europe and Asia-Pacific. At the Tokyo conference, 71 young members signed up, and 58 attended in person. It was impressive that one third of the participants were from outside Japan, providing our young members with a great opportunity for international networking.

Under the theme of "Forecasting the Future of the IP Industry", we conducted the following three sessions, all of which focused on the latest IP related issues that are currently being discussed in various jurisdictions.



#### Session 1-Generative AI to Innovate Our Work

The panelists from the AI service providers discussed the potential of Generative AI to streamline and enhance work efficiency in the Intellectual Property industry.

#### Session 2- Anticipating Possible Regulations on AI for the Future

The panelists specializing in IP laws discussed possible or proposed regulations on AI across jurisdictions regarding copyright, privacy, human well-being, and so on.

#### Session 3- IP Protection in a Networked World: Addressing Cross-Border Challenges

The panelists specializing in IP laws discussed legal frameworks and IP protection in cross-border IP infringement cases.



In addition to the wonderful sessions, the participants enjoyed communicating and conversing throughout the conference. The day before the conference, we hosted a Sponsors and Speakers Dinner on a *yakata-bune*, a Japanese traditional houseboat, which helped the sponsors and speakers get to know each other before the conference.
